

# Club Champion Shoot-Off Details and Rules

Bushy Creek Clays, Santa Rosa Shooting Center, Southern Tactical Range and Taylor Creek Sporting Clays are coming together to put on a special event. Each of these four clubs will hold a Club Championship Sporting Clay Shoot over the next few months. From the results of each Club Championship, a four-person team will be selected to represent each club. These four teams will compete against each other to determine which club has the best team. This event will be called the "Club Champion Shoot-Off".

The purpose of this event is to bring members from the four clubs together for fellowship, shooting fun, and serious competition. Plus, the winning club will get bragging rights for the next year.

This event will be held on February 29, 2020 at Bushy Creek. At a later date, Bushy Creek will send out an announcement about start time and other event day details.

This event will be an on-going annual event.

A drawing was held to determine which club would host the inaugural event and as noted above, Bushy Creek was picked to be the first host. Santa Rosa will host this event in 2021. Taylor Creek will be the host in 2022 and Southern Tactical will be the host in 2023.

Each year the host club will determine if this event will be a NSCA Registered Event. For this first year at Bushy Creek, it will not be a registered event.

The intent is to grow this event. In the future, more clubs may be added to this event.

The four clubs will hold a Club Championship Shoot independent from each other. Each club will determine how their Club Championship is run, the rules, the date, NSCA Register event or not and any other details associated with their Club Championship. The following rules will apply only to the Club Champion Shoot-Off and not the Club Championship.

The team for each club will be determined by the top four shooters at the Club Championship. The members of each team must be a Club Member of the club they are representing. If one, or more, of the top four shooters are not Club Members, the club will put the 5<sup>th</sup> place club member shooter on the team and will continue with the 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, etc. place club shooters until they fill their four-person team. To be on the team, you must be a Club Member of the club you are representing.

If a shooter, or several shooters, are club members at more than one club and are in the top four shooters at more than one Club Championship, then that shooter (or shooters) gets to pick which club they want to represent. The other clubs that the shooter doesn't select will fill their team by going to the 5<sup>th</sup> place club member shooter and 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> place if necessary.

Each club will also select Stand-By Shooters (alternates) in case one of their top four shooters is unable or unavailable for the Club Champion Shoot-Off. The Stand-By shooters will be selected from the 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> place club member shooters. The 5<sup>th</sup> place club shooter will be the first alternate. The 6<sup>th</sup> place club shooter is the second alternate. This alternate selection will continue as necessary. All alternates must be club members of the club they are representing.

Each shooter is responsible for providing their own ammo. The club that the shooters are representing will pay the entry fee for their team.

NSCA rules will be followed, including the rules about participants setting targets and shooting targets prior to the event.

The teams will be squadded as follows:

The top shooters (highest score at the Club Championship) will squad together to be Team 1.

The second-place shooters will squad together to be Team 2.

The third-place shooters will squad together to be Team 3.

The fourth-place shooters will squad together to be Team 4.

No one will be shooting with a member of their club team.

Scores from the club's four members will be added together for the Team Score. High score wins. Should there be a tie for high score, the host club will determine how to break the tie.

The winning team will get a trophy that the winning club gets to keep for the following year. The trophy will have a plaque that will be inscribed with the year, winning club name, and the names of the four-person team. The same trophy will be used year after year with the old plaques remaining and new plaques added each year.
